Constraints of Farming Activity Individually

- Small land holdings make farming unviable, not yielding surpluses enough for market play
- High input costs due to low quantities procured
- Inability to hold stocks for a later day price discovery
- Inability to access markets, often forcing them into distress selling
- Low skill levels for optimal production





Constraints of Farming Activity Individually

- Insufficient capital for investment
- Lack of assets for farming activity
- No storage facility
- Sale of produce in raw form with little in situ value addition



Benefit of Farmers Acting Collectively

- Advantage of economies of scale
- Timely availability of input at lower prices
- Quality extension and advisory services
- Knowledge about improved agricultural practices
- Easier access to credit
- Collective bargaining power for farmer produce

- Post-harvest processing and value addition services
- Aggregation of produce and bulk transport to distance market, enhancing net income of the producer
- Profit maximization through reduced cost of cultivation, improved production and enhanced prices for farm produce

Farmer Producer Organization

A **FPO** is a legal entity formed by **primary producers**, such as farmers, milk producers, fishermen, weavers, rural artisans, craftsmen and others. It can be a **producer company, a cooperative society** or any other legal form which provides for **sharing of profits/benefits among the members**.

FPOs are the very effective institutional form for **collectivization** of farmers. FPOs help in taking up of different activities like **processing**, **value addition**, **storage**, **marketing**, **finance**, **input supply**, **seed production** etc. collectively on their own.



Values of FPO

The following are values of co-operation that have to be inculcated by any FPO.

Join together and try to make a difference at our family, our village, our block and even at our local community level.

Fulfil minimum responsibilities as stipulated in its by-laws and business rules by supporting its activities and use its services.

Democracy:

 All members are equal.
 Voting power cannot be bought. It is one member, one vote.

 All members have an equal opportunity to get involved, like campaigning for fair trade

 Commit to fairness in all aspects. Share capital or equity should be same for each members

Assistance Principles (MAPs) as spelled out in Subsection (2) of Section 581G of the Companies Act, 2013.
The Act specifies that these principles should be part of
the Articles of the Producer Company. Mutual
Assistance Principles are almost in similar line with
Cooperative Principles given below

Key Features of FPOs

- Business Enterprise: Provide preproduction, production, post production services
- Autonomous & Independent:
 Farmers own enterprise, private in nature
- Formal organization: Registered, legal entity with staff and systems
- Member owned: Owned, used and controlled by members, Provide required services to members

- Equity from members: Members contribute to capital
- Self-governance: Governed by Board of Directors, elected by and from members
- Democratic control: One member, one vote





Appropriate Legal Forms for FPOs


- Producer Company under Companies Act 2013, Ministry of Corporate Affairs, Government of India. Producer Companies are guided by the Articles of Association (AoA) as laid down by the Producer Company and approved by Registrar of Companies
- Cooperative under Multi State Cooperative Societies Act, Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Government of India. Cooperatives are guided by the By-laws as laid down by the Cooperative and approved by Registrar of Cooperatives
- Under Cooperative Acts of concerned States. For example, Mutually Aided Cooperative Societies (MACS) Act 1995, Andhra Pradesh

Note: Articles of Association/ By laws detail out the objects of the FPO, different aspects of their activities and serve as guiding document for functioning of FPOs.


